NEWS from our missionary Dr. Belinda Forbes in Nicaragua

(Belinda works for the AMOS Health Care Agency in providing the basic health care for many villages.) She is our General Board of Global Ministries missionary.

AMOS Health and Hope and WATER

2024 is off to a busy start at AMOS as the organization continues with multiple activities in health and mission partnerships.



AMOS Mission Teams – AMOS hosted 4 mission teams this year and has plans for more! Belinda was privileged to accompany two teams in February:

First was the McGregor Team to La Pimienta, Chinandega. The La Pimienta community was built after Hurricane Mitch in 1998 and most of its older residents remember clearly the damage caused by rain and floods that occasioned their resettlement to higher ground. This was my second time* joining this team of (mostly) upstate New Yorkers whose skill and generosity provided sustainable energy through a solar panel installation in the community clinic. Lights are on for the first time in La Pimienta, praise God!



In addition, and for the first time, AMOS's WASH Program carried out **water testing** in the field (usually samples are taken back to Managua) using portable testing kits. Samples were taken from home filters – **old and new, and from wells and streams where families collect their water**. The results showed the spring water in a small creek to be the most contaminated and demonstrated the water filters to be effective in providing **safe drinking water** for families. AMOS continues to **distribute home water filters**, prioritizing pregnant women and children under five years of age. Water promoters organized and trained by AMOS are actively installing filters and providing follow-up to their use and maintenance.

Other activities included cabinetry and benches for the community clinic giving patients somewhere to sit while waiting for care, a first-aid training to members of the community health committee and a **Vacation Bible School for children with a focus on clean water** and hygiene. We struggled to stay cool in the roundthe-clock 100-degree weather and avoid local scorpions but could celebrate AMOS's integrated mission approach and fellowship with the local leaders and churches who made us feel welcome.

Next came St. John's Episcopal Church from Jackson, Wyoming to San Jose de la Mula, Matagalpa. Team members came with health, education and business backgrounds to participate in a community health fair and support Norlan Flores, the local health promoter trained by AMOS in his ongoing work to promote

health and wellbeing in this remote, mountainous, historical community of Nicaragua. The fair included services to monitor the weight and height of children under 5 years of age, provide vitamins and nutritional counseling for pregnant women and new mothers,



talks on oral health with schoolchildren, and information sharing with women. Children were delighted with a Vacation Bible School in the afternoons with plenty of crafts and coloring. Thirty-eight water filters were installed by members of the team and AMOS water promoters.

Improving wheelchair access to Fisk Sanctuary

Fisk will soon be able to celebrate a milestone. We will be increasing the number of wheelchair accessible spaces in our Sanctuary. Hallelujah!

The Fisk Trustees sought out and listened to multiple congregation members about how best to accomplish this. We considered two alternatives: cut away the end section of several pews to fit a wheelchair at the end of those pews, or remove the entire pew to allow easy and flexible access for those in wheelchairs, walkers, and those people accompanying them. At the February 26 Administrative Board meeting, it was voted 9-0-4 to approve the removal of two pews on the pulpit side of the Sanctuary.

To help you visualize this new look, below is a fabricated picture of what the pulpit side of the Sanctuary will look like after the 6th and 7th pews are removed.

To make the opening welcoming for all, we will place a few comfortable congregation chairs (see below) so that families and friends can sit together as desired. The congregation chairs will be donated by the Sinclair Fund that was repurposed "to enhance the worship experience for the entire congregation" as requested by Winnie Sinclair and her family. We thank Winnie for her generosity and celebrate her loving and upbeat spirit. We also thank all those members who have contributed to the Sinclair Youth Fund over the years.

The Trustees and their helpers will begin work on removing the sixth and seventh pews and the congregation chairs will be ordered. In the meantime, temporary chairs will occupy the opening. May God's peace and grace be yours, The Trustees of Fisk UMC
